

What is Foster Care?



Foster Care is the placement of a child with a person who is not the child's parent, relative or guardian and who is willing to undertake the care and maintenance of that child.

Which child can be considered for Foster Care?

Most of the children who are considered for foster care are innocent victims of difficult circumstances or neglect. They include children who are: orphans, abandoned, neglected, abused, in the streets and other emergency situations.

They are vulnerable and often come into care with either emotional or physical scars hence the need for love and family in their best interest. By caring and spending time with them, you can change the direction of their life in a positive and meaningful way.

Have you ever thought of fostering a child?

Evidence-based research shows that children do best within families and when living within their communities. This is because they can establish lifelong bonds and develop to their full potential. It implies that every child needs and deserves to grow up in a safe and protected environment from abuse and neglect.

Therefore, caring foster parents offer children support and stability when they need it most.

Why should I become a foster parent?

- 1. to protect and nurture children by providing a safe, healthy environment with wholesome support;
- 2. to promote long term parental care, towards family reunification in the first instance, or by accommodating children in alternative, safe

and nurturing family relationships intended to last their lifetime;

3. to promote the building of family relationships in the context of Kenya's cultural, ethnic and community diversity.

How do I become a foster parent?

- Fill a foster care application form at the children's office
- Participate in Foster parents' assessment and training
- Follow indication on the required documentation
- Prepare for placement of the child in the family
- Enable the child to experience a sustainable family life

Who qualifies to be a Foster Parent?


- 1. I am a Kenyan citizen or I have been a resident for at least 12 months continuously
- 2. I am at least 25 years and below 65 years old.
- 3. I can demonstrate I have the knowledge

and skills to protect and nurture the child in a safe and healthy environment.





What kind of support will I get?



How long will a child stay in my home?

The maximum period to foster a child is 3 years reviewed by the Sub County Children office on an annual basis.

During this time, the Sub-county children officer will monitor and follow-up on the welfare of the child and your relationship every year. The situation in the family of origin is also addressed with the aim of improving it.

After this period, the child will be reintegrated back home or a long-term p lacement alternative explored.

Mtoto wa kuzigatiwa katika **Foster Care?**

Wengi wa watoto wanaozingatiwa kwa foster care ni waathirika wa hali ngumu ya maisha wasio na hatia, au wasio na malezi. Kwa mfano watoto yatima, waliotelekezwa,waliopuuzwa, walionyanyaswa, walio mitaani na hali zingine za dharura.

(b)Ili tuendeleze malezi ya muda mrefu kutoka kwa wazazi na kuwezesha watoto kuunganishwa tena na familia zao za asili. Ama kuwawezesha watoto wapate makazi tofauti yaliyo salama na uhusiano wa kifamilia ambao utawasaidia maisha yao ya baadaye.

- 2. Unahitajika kuwa na umri wa miaka 25 na chini ya miaka 65
